5. **REGULAR BUSINESS**

**A. Glenview Drive Traffic Tool**

**Senior Civil Engineer Harry Yip** gave a presentation regarding the successful resident petition for Traffic Calming on Glenview Drive from San Bruno Avenue to Claremont Drive, the verification of a speeding issue, and the recommended mitigations that would be sent residents for a final vote.

**PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD OPENED**

**Siddhartha** of Glenview Drive commented on stop signs, peak speeds, drivers performing donuts at intersections.

**Imelda** of Glenview Drive commented on the previous traffic calming attempts and how residents outside of the neighborhood may have kept some solutions from being implemented.

**Neal** of Glenview Drive commented possibility of stop signs.

**Viki** of Glenview Drive commented on vehicles performing donuts and the possibility of enhanced crosswalks near the parks and at San Bruno Ave.

**PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD CLOSED**

The TSPC had a discussion regarding resident comments and responded to the questions.

**M/S Collins/Quinn** to recommend placing on the postcards for resident vote, the follow options: Speed Humps (rubber or asphalt), speed radar feedback signs, and/or traffic circles; and to also review collision data and possibility of crosswalk enhancements on the corridor. The motion passed unanimously.

**B. Huntington Avenue and Florida Avenue**

**Senior Civil Engineer Yip** gave a presentation on recommended enhancements to Huntington Ave from Florida Avenue to Georgia Avenue

**Tim** of Florida Avenue commented on the difficulty of navigating the intersection of Florida Avenue and Huntington Ave.

**Siddhartha** of Glenview Drive asked on how residents can help.

**Larry** of Huntington Avenue commented on extending the painting of red curb around the existing fire hydrant and the proposed crosswalk across Florida Avenue.

**Tovar** of Florida Avenue made comment on the crosswalk and stop signs.

**Alicia** of Florida Avenue commented on the concepts.

The TSPC had a discussion regarding the proposed improvements.

**M/S Collins/Hannibal** to recommend Alternative 1 of the crosswalk, and pavement marking enhancements with the possibility of narrowing the crosswalk at Florida Avenue and a right-turn pocket north of Florida Avenue and implement the red-curb to the full 15 feet from the fire hydrant as stated at California Vehicle Code. The motion passed unanimously.
