GOVERNOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDER N-25-20****

CORONAVIRUS COVID-19

AND SAN MATEO COUNTY HEALTH DIRECTIVE

FROM April 14, 2020

On March 17, 2020, the Governor of California issued Executive Order N-29-20 suspending certain provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act in order to allow for local legislative bodies to conduct their meetings telephonically or by other electronic means. Pursuant to the current Shelter-In-Place Order issued by the San Mateo County Health Officer which became effective on March 17, 2020, and which was updated and extended on March 31, 2020; the statewide Shelter-In-Place Order issued by the Governor in Executive Order N-33-20 on March 19, 2020; and the CDC's social distancing guidelines which discourage large public gatherings, the San Bruno City Council Chambers at the Senior Center is no longer open to the public for meetings of the City Council.

If you would like to make a Public Comment on an item not on the agenda, or comment on a particular agenda item, please email gsexson@sanbruno.ca.gov. The length of all emailed comments should be commensurate with the three minutes customarily allowed per speaker, which is approximately 300 words total. Emails received before the special or regular meeting start time will be forwarded to the City Council, posted on the City's website and will become part of the public record for that meeting. If emailed comments are received after the meeting start time, or after the meeting ends, they will be forwarded to the City Council and filed with the agenda packet becoming part of the public record for that meeting.

7. Staff Reports:

- Officer Sexson looked at the impact of the City's Flock cameras. Over the past 12 months, there have been 42 cases which resulted in an arrest due to the cameras. The cases are mainly stolen vehicles, but the cameras did help identify the vehicle used in the recent armed robberies at 7/11. On July 4th, there were 22 citations for possession/use of illegal fireworks. Robert Riechel noted from the most recent City Council meeting that over half of the citations were to non-residents. Deanna Robinson asked if allowing legal fireworks drives the use of illegal fireworks in San Bruno. Officer Sexson did not have any data to confirm/deny this. Robert Riechel requested an update on the homeless population in San Bruno. Officer Sexson spoke specifically about outreach to an individual on San Mateo Avenue who has so far refused assistance. This individual has the permission of the property owner to stay on the property until a more permanent housing solution is found.



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8. Committee Business:

- **Follow-up on open items from last meeting**
 - In person vs. remote meeting – Increasing hospitalizations due to the latest COVID variant were noted. The Committee will still be meeting remotely.
 - City Council support – Linda Mason was unable to join. She has offered support, and is organizing City Council support for National Night Out.
 - Letter to USPS – Peter Carey delivered the letter to the Postmaster, and has had contact with the Union representative, but has not received any feedback.
 - New/Replacement Neighborhood Watch signs. – New signs were ordered, and were scheduled to arrive this week. It is anticipated that the new signs will be posted and old signs replaced by the end of next week.
- **Neighborhood Watch Communities**
 - Public Comments:
 - Neighborhood Watch Block Captain updates – Darlene and Tom are coordinating for National Night Out, and asked if they need permission to hold their event at the dead end of their street. Office Sexson is following up. Tom is also advertising the upcoming Chat with the Chief scheduled for their neighborhood.
 - Current NHW Groups
 - 13 groups active
- **Committee Outreach**
 - Crime Tips
 - 2 topics for next month crime tips for CityNet and Social Media – 1) Purpose and benefits to hosting for National Night Out, and 2) existing Crime Tip titled Expected Deliveries. Motion to approve from Robert Riechel, Second from Peter Carey. Motion passed.
- **NHW Signage**
 - Window stickers – Peter Carey ordered some stickers for his neighborhood, but they were unimpressive. Robert Riechel provided an electronic copy of a previous window sticker that was used. Tom noted the need for signage to be big enough to be legible from the street. Chad Keele will follow up with Officer Sexson on getting new stickers made.
- **Dog Walker Watch**
 - Materials – Waiting for approval from the Chief if the National materials can be purchased, or if we will need to make our own.
 - How to approach this community? – Darlene Robinson suggested public posting, and Officer Sexson is looking into any restrictions. Chad Keel is willing to test in his community. Tom suggested posting on dog waste bag dispensers.
