

## Getting started with NOOK® Tablets

You can use the OverDrive app to borrow and enjoy eBooks and audiobooks from your library on your NOOK tablet.

### Step 1

Download the OverDrive app from one of the following:

- Google Play
- NOOK Apps Store



### Step 2

Open the OverDrive app and follow the prompts to create an OverDrive account and log in. If you are under 13, select **I am under 13 years old** instead.

*Note: Only newer versions of the OverDrive app will prompt you to sign in or sign up for an OverDrive account. If you do not see these prompts, move on to Step 3.*

### Step 3

In the OverDrive app, find your library's OverDrive-powered website. On most NOOK tablets, you can do this by swiping from left to right to open the **Home menu**, then tapping **Add a library**. On a NOOK Color or Tablet, tap the  icon (or if you do not have this icon, go to *Menu > Get Books*).

- Tap the star to save your library's website (Peninsula Library System) to your library list.
- Tap **Peninsula Library System** to start browsing.

### Step 4

Log into your library's OverDrive website with your library card and borrow a title.

### Step 5

Find borrowed titles under your account on your library's OverDrive website. You can:


- Download EPUB eBooks\* and MP3 audiobooks directly to the OverDrive app.
- Tap **Read** to open and read OverDrive Read eBooks right in your browser.
- If you have installed the Kindle® reading app from the Google Play Store on your NOOK, select **Kindle Book (U.S. only)** to complete checkout on Amazon's website and send the book to your Kindle reading app.

*\*Note: If you are using a NOOK Color or Tablet, you will need to authorize your device with an Adobe ID to download EPUB eBooks. It is a one-time, free process that takes just moments to complete.*
