On Sunday, May 29, 2016, at approximately 3:30 p.m., San Bruno Police Officers responded to the 2400 block of Oakmont Drive regarding the report of suspicious circumstances. An alert homeowner returned home to find the three Hispanic males, depicted in the photographs below, standing in front of his residence. The subjects informed the homeowner that they were waiting to be picked up. The subjects then left the area with a fourth subject driving a white Honda Civic.

Video footage in the area shows the three subjects being dropped off by the white Honda Civic just moments prior to the homeowner returning home. Investigators suspect, based on the subjects actions, that they intended to commit a residential burglary.

Residential burglaries are on the rise in all communities. San Bruno Police Detectives are collaborating with other agencies and diligently working to solve these crimes. Our investigators have identified suspects through DNA evidence and by other means. We are diligently following up on all other leads and evidence.

The San Bruno Police Department will continue to deploy uniformed and plainclothes officers to conduct enforcement and surveillance operations in an effort to combat these types of crimes.

Most residential burglars select a residence where they believe no one is home. In order to ensure this, they often knock on a door. If they get an answer they will come up with an excuse for knocking. If they get no answer they commit the burglary. Alert neighbors

provide the biggest help to police in solving these crimes. We encourage the community to remain vigilant and immediately report any suspicious vehicles or activity via 911.

If you return home to find suspicious persons at or near your residence, call 9-1-1. Don't confront the suspects. If you find an open/broken window or door, do not enter. The perpetrators may still be inside. Use a cellular phone or a neighbors phone to call 9-1-1 and write down license plate numbers of suspicious vehicles. Note descriptions of suspicious persons.
